What does a job coach do?

A Job Coach assists a person with a disability at their job. This may include:

- Helping the person learn the job tasks
- Supporting individuals to build relationships with coworkers
- Learning about the rules of the business
- Supporting the person to be successful at work
- Personal care at work

What are the benefits of being a PSW Job Coach?

- Earn higher wages while working as a PSW job coach
- Start a career pathway in I/DD Employment Services
- Job satisfaction knowing you are helping someone become more independent
